SUNDAY CHURCH SCHOOL LESSONS | MARCH 2024

SPRING QUARTER THEME: EXAMINING OUR FAITH

According to the writer of the lessons, the Greek word for "faith" appears over two hundred times in the New Testament. The word's usage can refer to at least two different but related concepts. This quarter we will explore the significance of faith and how the people of God live with faith.

Prior to proceeding, let's briefly look at the two concepts of related faith. The expression "the faith" refers to the beliefs and paradigms distinct to followers of Jesus (examples: Acts 6:7; 1 Corinthians 16:13; 2 Corinthians 13:5; 1 Timothy 3:9; Jude 3). The most central belief and the key to the faith itself, however, is the resurrection of Jesus Christ (see Mark 16:1-8). Without Jesus' death and resurrection, our faith would be in vain. "The faith" can also be referred to as "Community Faith."

Scripture's second use of the word "faith" consists of belief in Christ and trust in God. One way a person's faith is revealed is through their decisions and behavior. As we know, the Gospels provide numerous examples of people who demonstrated faith through their actions.

One example will suffice here. The faith of a centurion led him to ask Jesus for the long-distance healing of his servant (Luke 7:1-10).

The quarter's final unit investigates the spiritual benefits of having faith in Christ. A person can have faith after they hear the good news of Christ (Romans 10:14-17). Believers enter the community of God's people by confessing sin and believing that Jesus is Lord. As a result, believers can rejoice! Because of our faith in Christ, we celebrate a relationship of peace with God. We were once adversaries of God, but by our faith, we have received the ultimate benefit of becoming children of God.

Nevertheless, donations are still welcome and they will continue to be segregated out and the funds will be used for repairs for 208 Simpson Road and any items that do not fall within the auspices of the ARPA Grant.

Women Called by God

The status of people of color especially women in the 1700-1800's was that of being a domestic or working in the field except when there was a higher call from God. History records three women who when inspired by God to preach His gospel persisted until pulpits were opened to them.

Jarena Lee was born in 1783 in Cape May, New Jersey to free parents and remained there until she left as a teenager to move to the Philadelphia area. Although she did not receive religious instruction as a child, she was introduced to religious teachings while avivals. Her conversion occurred around 1804 when she was overcome by the Holy Spirit and heard the voice of God telling her to "Go preach the gospel." First, she attended a white Episcopal church, which was not welcoming to her, so like Richard Allen, she left and began attending Mother Bethel which was newly established as the first African Methodist Episcopal Church in America. Allen's method of preaching inspired her and after being a member for a while she asked him if she could reach. She was refused, but one Sunday when the preacher of the morning was unable to finish his sermon, she took over for him and finished his message. Being impressed by her word, Rev. Allen changed his mind and allowed her to preach even though there was no provision for women to preach in 1819 according to the AME Church. Consequently, he would not ordain her. Her ministry then became an itinerant one. She travelled extensively throughout the east coast preaching in New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia, Ohio, Michigan and even Canada. One year she travelled 2,325 miles and preached 178 sermons. Jarena Lee died a widow, penniless and still not ordained until 2016 when on July 13, 2016 at the closing session of the 50th General Conference of the AME Church held in Philadelphia, PA she was posthumously ordained Rev. Jarena Lee. Two hundred and twelve years after she began her journey with the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Less known is Juliann Jane Tillman, a contemporary of Jarena Lee, who like Lee said she had several visits by an angel holding a scroll that said "Thee I have chosen you to preach my gospel without delay." She was obedient and did preach God's word although like Jarena Lee was never ordained by the AME Church.

Julia A. J. Foote was born in Schenectady, New York in 1823. Although she was originally an AME, she left the AME Church and was ordained the first female deacon in the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church and the second woman to be ordained an elder. Her conversion began around age fifteen when she first experienced visits from the Holy Spirit. Julia Foote was a leader in the Wesleyan-Holiness movement and preached the doctrine of sanctification throughout pulpits of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion connection. Unfortunately, God's call on her life impacted her marriage because her husband was not supportive of his wife preaching. She remained in the marriage until his death then traveled extensively across the United States fulfilling God's desire for her to preach His word. Julia Foote died in 1901.



What Is Lent Today?



Today, Lent is observed during the 40-day period between Ash Wednesday and Resurrection Sunday. This is a time to set aside our wants and needs and become humble and meek before God, recognizing our need for the Savior above all things. Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent reminds us that we are from dust and to dust we'll return (Gen 3:17-19). Ash Wednesday serves as a reminder that we will die and face the consequences of our sins. The meaning and purpose of Lent are to reflect on our sinful nature and praise God for the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Jesus came to serve, live, and die for our sins. Lent ends on the glorious day that the Lord resurrected. We are no longer cursed to the grave, but our sins are forgiven.

Lent continues into the Holy Week with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday events. Maundy Thursday commemorates the day Jesus celebrated Passover with his disciples, washed their feet, and retreated to the Garden of Gethsemane for prayer. During the Passover meal Jesus institutes, the act of Communion and remembering His sacrifice. Good Friday is the day Jesus was crucified. It is called "good" because of the sacrifice of Jesus for our sins. Without this "good" day, we would not have the forgiveness of sins and the gift of eternal life in heaven.

Observing Lent and Its Purpose

Many choose to observe Lent with fasting and prayer. The act of fasting is simply abstaining from something to focus on something else. When we give up something, such as food, social media, or TV, we are given time to reflect on our faith and grow our relationship with God. As we sacrifice something we usually turn to, we remember the sacrifices of Jesus Christ. Fasting and prayer during Lent also symbolize the 40 days and nights Jesus fasted in the desert as the devil tempted him. Through Lent, we come to the realization of our own sins, connect with Jesus during his temptation and experience freedom from sin through his death and resurrection.

The Old Testament and New Testament gives us guidelines and examples for fasting. Whether you observe Lent with daily scripture, reflections or fasting and prayer, there are helpful Bible verses for remembering the sacrifices of the Lord. Let some of these scriptures encourage your faith and strengthen your relationship with Jesus.



MARCH 2024 BLACK HISTORY FACTS CELEBRATING WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

SUNDAY, MARCH 3, 2024

SARA BASS ALLEN was born in 1764 in the Isle of Wight County, Virginia, as a slave. At eight years of she was brought of Philadelphia and became free around the age of her thirties maybe younger. She met and married a formerly enslaved Richard Allen, the Father and founder of Bethel AME Church. It was during this union she became the Mother of the AME denomination. Together the Allens became a powerful team serving God and the community. The Allens being former enslaved persons dedicated themselves to assist runaways knowing first hand what it meant to be enslaved and the desire to be free. Their home became a stop and haven for the Underground Railroad. There they fed, clothed and gave money to the runaways. Sometimes they hid them in their home and other times they hid them in the church. Even after Richard Allen's death Mother Allen continued this work.

With freedom of not being attached with Anglo churches they were free to be abolitionists, conductors of the Underround Railroad and serving others in the community without restrictions. This freedom attracted others to become members and ministers of this denomination. The church grew in numbers. The women of the church under the leadership of Sara Allen became very active in and out of the church. Bishop Allen referred to them as the Dorcas Society. This society is now still in existence known as the Sara Allen Missionaries.

The Sara Allen Missionaries started one of the first day care centers in the United States, nursed and visited the sick, fed the hungry and financially supported the needs of the poor. Thank You Mother Sara Allen, your living was not in vain.

SUNDAY, MARCH 10, 2024

DR. KIZZMEKIA CORBETT was born 1986 in Hurdle Hills North Carolina to Rhonda Brooks. She grew up in Hillsborough, North Carolina and attended school there. At an early age she was recognized as an outstanding student interested in science. Miss Corbett attended college in Baltimore and worked as a Biological Sciences Trainer at the National Institute of Health.



Dr. Corbett began her research at NITT after receiving her PHD in Microbiologyand Immunology . She began working on the development of vaccines for Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrme(SARS) and Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) two types of corona viruses. Along with her teamates she saw a strange change in protein in COVID-19 when the virus became known in 2019. She was chosen to lead a team of scientists to find a vaccine. In 2020 President Donald Trump gave an 8.3 billion dollar to the emergency corona virus response and 3 billion was used for research on a vaccine and treatment.

While most African Americans were leary of the vaccine Dr. Fauci bravely supported her by saying "the first thing you might want to say to my African American brothers and sisters is that the vaccine that you're going to be taking was developed by an African American Woman."

Thank you Dr. Corbett for your contribution. We at the Bethel Community Life Center appreciate your work as we do offer that vaccine. The clinic has vaccinated thousands of people and we are not only grateful but proud of you.

MARCH 2024 BLACK HISTORY FACTS CELEBRATING WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

SUNDAY, MARCH 17, 2024

REV. JARENA LEE was the first woman preacher in the AME church, not Reverend Carolyn Cavaness (smile). She was born in 1786 as a free person of color in Cape May, New Jersey. She married a minister and later moved to Philadelphia. While living in Phiadelphia she met and voiced her desire to preach to Bishop Richard Allen. I guess you can say that since the beginning of time, women were not allowed to become ministers and Richard Allen denied her request. One Sunday at a service in 1819 the preacher had a problem finishing his sermon, Jarena Lee had the nerve to finish it for him and her boldness impressed Bishop Allen. Still, he could not give her the a license to preach but did endorse her as a traveling speaker. Lee could not accept the fact that God only blessed and ordained men. If that's so he would not be a lovining Father to all, but a half of a Father who only empowered only one half of his children, men. Something we all know, is that God loves us all.

Mrs. Lee became a traveling minister facing all kinds of hostilities and prejudice. She travelled on foot for thousands of miles preaching the word of God and fighting for the abolishment of slavery. In 1852 the AME church offically ruled that women were not allowed to preach. Mrs. lee stopped preaching but still spoke out against slavery. We can be thankful that women are now allowed in the pulpit. Someone knew and understood that women were and are capable of spreading the Word . Someone knew that the God we serve is not a God for men only but a God for women as well.

SUNDAY, MARCH 24, 2024

MARY ANN SHADD CARY was born 1823 in Wilmington, Delaware she was one of thirteen children. She was free born and was raised in a household of abolitionists. The family had been activists and conductors on the Underground Railroad for years. When it became illegal for African American children to get an education in Delaware the family moved to West Chester and Philadelphia. Both homes served as stops for the Underground Railroad. Mrs. Cary as a child attended a Quaker Boarding School. In 1840 she started a school for black children. She also taught in Norristown and New York.

In 1850, the Fugitive Slave Act was passed. It threatend to return free Northern blacks and escaped slaves back into slavery. Mary Ann's father took his family and moved to Canada. She and her brother stayed behind and later joined the family in Canada. In Canada she became the first African American woman to own and operate a newspaper. Later in life she returned to the United States, attended Howard University and received a law degree.

Mrs. Cary was not afraid to be an outspoken advocate of womens rights and various causes. She fiercely pursued opportunities that excluded women. She has been quoted qs saying "I'm opening the door for black women and I'm proud that I'm doing that and I'm trying to create a space for you to have a voice". And that she did!!!

Unfortunately they could not overcome the racism and sexism of the times. Even though the teams didn't last long they did make a statement and made history. They stood up and tried to step into the world known as equality. They were brave women who tried to make a difference and they did1 Just ask Mo'ne Davis.

BETHEL COMMUNITY GARDEN	Community Garden is currently preparing to launch formally on Saturday, April 6, 2024, at Harverfarm at Haverford College. Several work day opportunities are available to assist in preparing for the 2024 growing season.	
TEMPORARY OFFICE LOCATION	A temporary office location has been secured at Ardmore Presbyterian Church for the Pastor, Community Garden Program and in other necessary administrative operations for the church.	
VACCINATION CLINICS	Vaccination Clinics will still take place in the Narthex of the church. We are grateful that Ardmore United Methodist Church has opened their doors to us for Vaccination Clinics when needed.	
BUILDING CLEAN OUT AND DEMOLITION	The process of the building clean out and demolition is still underway.	

It has been articulated to our Consultant/Architectural Team that we would like as much possible to be sure that we can continue to have Sunday Worship in the Sanctuary during the construction period.

FLU SYMPTOMS & DIAGNOSIS

Common flu symptoms usually come on suddenly and can include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills (note that not everyone with flu will have a fever)
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose

- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Vomiting and diarrhea may be common in children

Especially with flu and COVID circulating together-along with other respiratory diseases like RSV —it's important to be properly diagnosed to determine appropriate treatment. There are a number of tests available to determine if you have the flu. Your healthcare provider may test you for flu or diagnose you based on your symptoms.



The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
Administration (SAMHSA) is the lead federal agency,

Commission and the Department of Veterans Affairs,
working to make the promise of 988 a reality for America.
Moving to a 3-digit dialing code is a once-in-a-lifetime
opportunity to strengthen and expand the existing
National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (the Lifeline).

Of course, 988 is more than just an easy-to-remember number—it is a direct connection to compassionate, accessible care and support for anyone experiencing mental health related distress – whether that is thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress. Preparing for full 988 implementation requires a bold vision for a crisis care system that provides direct, life-saving services to all in need.

SAMHSA sees 988 as a first step towards a transformed crisis care system in much the same way as emergency medical services have expanded in the US.



In pursuit of this bold yet achievable vision, SAMHSA is first focused on strengthening and expanding the existing Lifeline network, providing life-saving service to all who call, text or chat via 988. Longer term, SAMHSA recognizes that linking those in crisis to community-based providers—who can deliver a full range of crisis care services—is essential to meeting crisis needs across the nation.


