





SPRING QUARTER THEME: EXAMINING OUR FAITH

According to the writer of the lessons, the Greek word for "faith" appears over two hundred times in the New Testament. The word's usage can refer to at least two different but related concepts. This quarter we will explore the significance of faith and how the people of God live with faith.

Prior to proceeding, let's briefly look at the two concepts of related faith. The expression "the faith" refers to the beliefs and paradigms distinct to followers of Jesus (examples: Acts 6:7; 1 Corinthians 16:13; 2 Corinthians 13:5; 1 Timothy 3:9; Jude 3). The most central belief and the key to the faith itself, however, is the resurrection of Jesus Christ (see Mark 16:1-8). Without Jesus' death and resurrection, our faith would be in vain. "The faith" can also be referred to as "Community Faith."

Scripture's second use of the word "faith" consists of belief in Christ and trust in God. One way a person's faith is revealed is through their decisions and behavior. As we know, the Gospels provide numerous examples of people who demonstrated faith through their actions.

One example will suffice here. The faith of a centurion led him to ask Jesus for the long-distance healing of his servant (Luke 7:1-10).

and Finance. We are asking for 100% participation of our congregation in the Stewardship necessary to undergird the ministry of Bethel AME Church of Ardmore. 2023 Giving Statements were mailed January 31, 2024.

BETHEL RESTORATION CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The Bethel Restoration Campaign was launched as a five (5) year endeavor in order to support several key capital/ renovations for the church edifice and at the time our two (2) rental properties, 208 Simpson Road and 156 Walnut Lane. There have been many developments and pivots over these past five (5) years, however we are grateful to members of our congregation who have supported the various efforts either on a regular basis and/or when approached to support a specific effort. The Bethel Restoration Campaign funds have been segregated in their own account and have been used to underwrite the following improvements: Sanctuary Windows Restoration, various improvements and repairs for 156 Walnut Avenue, 208 Simpson Road and also the Church edifice.

In light of the generous grant received from the Montgomery County Recovery Office/ARPA the formal Bethel Restoration Campaign will be placed on a halt, HOWEVER we do anticipate having to re-initiate the Campaign as there maybe certain improvements/renovations that the ARPA grant may not be able to cover.

Nevertheless, donations are still welcome and they will continue to be segregated out and the funds will be used for repairs for 208 Simpson Road and any items that do not fall within the auspices of the ARPA Grant.

The 2024 Church Budget was approved at the Official Board/Church Conference held on Tuesday, November 14, 2023. *Thank you to Brother Jody Raines and Sister Cynthia Taylor for your leadership.*

Have you given thought to what stewardship is and if you are a good steward? Here are 10 Top Stewardship Verses for you to reflect on:

#10 2 CORINTHIANS 8

Generosity is not circumstantial and giving is a privilege. In this passage, Paul uses the story of the Macedonians' abundant generosity in the face of trial to encourage the Corinthians to give generously.

#9 MICAH 6:8

The focus of stewardship is not our money or our possessions, but rather the attitude of our heart. The attitudes of justice, kindness and humility shape the way we view, use and give our money and possessions.

#8 LUKE 18:18-27, ESPECIALLY 18:25 AND MARK 10:17-22

Stewardship is a matter of the heart. Our possessions often interfere with our relationship with God steering our focus from creator to creation. Although wealth brings many privileges and benefits, Jesus cautions his followers to beware of wealth's power to lure their hearts away from God.

#7 GENESIS 1:2-4 AND 1:27,31.

Stewardship originations from the creation story. In this story, God impresses God's own image upon humanity and charges humanity to care for all creation. God is the maker of all things and we are called to be responsible stewards of God's creation.

#6 2 CORINTHIANS 9

God provides all that we need and we give in response to God's provision. God desires intentional gifts that can be freely given with a smile. As we give we not only meet the needs of others, but we also give thanks to God.

#5 LUKE 19: 1-10

Stewardship is first and foremost about relationships. Zacchaeus' relationship with his possessions, and by consequence his relationship with others, is affected by Jesus' initiation of a relationship with him. Through our relationship with Jesus we are changed; our relationship with Jesus ignites within us a desire to use our possessions responsibly to meet the needs of others.

#4 LUKE 21:1-4 AND MARK 12:41-44

Jesus commends the widow for giving all that she had to live on. As stewards we are called to give our whole life – time, talent and treasure – to God. We are also called to create sustainable systems of giving so that the rich do not prosper at the expense of the poor. Stewardship is for everyone, the rich and the poor.

#3 MATTHEW 6:21 AND LUKE 12:34

Where you put your money takes your heart with it. "The point isn't that how we spend our money reveals what sort of people we are, but that how we spend money determines what sort of people we become."

#2 LUKE 10:25-37

The parable of the Good Samaritan reminds us that we, as stewards of God's world, are called to care for all creation, including our neighbors. Good stewards recklessly give of themselves to their neighbor and in doing so model God's love for all creation.

#1 MATTHEW 25:13-40

The parable of the ten talents emphasizes that we are all stewards, no matter how little or how much God has entrusted us with. As stewards, how we spend, save and share our money matters to God.



The African Methodist Episcopal Church today sees the role and function of the class leader and the class meeting system as vital to the life of the congregation. Many local churches have class leaders' councils or class leaders' boards who meet on a regular basis (usually once a month) for the purpose of:


- Encouraging one another spiritually and emotionally;

APRIL 2024 BLACK HISTORY FACTS

SUNDAY, APRIL 7, 2024 LEWIS LATIMER

LEWIS LATIMER was born to parents that ran away from slavery. They left Virginia and settled in Massachusetts. At the time they were wanted as fugitives with a bounty on their heads. Ther criminal act was they wanted to be free. The parents were captured in Boston. Mr. Latimer's father George, went to trial and was defended in court by Frederick Douglass and William Garrison. When he was released from prison George Latimer purchased his freedom with the help of a local minister. He stayed with his family until 1857.



Lewis Latimer step in his father's place and became the provider of the family. He lied about his age and fought in the Civil War. After the war he worked in a drafting and patent office. He taught himself by watching other workers how to draft patents and mechanical drawing.

He later became and inventor. Some of his inventions were the improvement of the railroad bathroom and air conditioning units. He worked with Thomas Edison on his light bulb design and patent and with Alexander Graham Bell doing the same. For years in some African American communities, it has been said that he was the actual inventor. Maybe he did and maybe he didn't, all I know is being a retiree from the telephone compay his involvement was recognized until the 1980's. If they did recognize him earlier it was never put in any book to be read in schools.

SUNDAY, APRIL 14, 2024 GARRETT MORGAN

GARRETT MORGAN lived in Cincinnati, Ohio. He came from a very large family as a young man he had to leave school early to help support his family. Mr. Morgan only went as far as elementary school. Back then most children only received some schooling, leaving at ages twelve or younger to help support their families. He found work at a sewing machine factory fixing machines. He was so clever he worked on a machine to see if he could improve it and when he did he applied for a patent and started his own



business. His business was a success. He later became the fore father to the hair relaxer business.. He had his formula patented and that too became a success. Black folks had been using a concoction of soap lye and other stuff to make their hair straight, but he was smart enough to have it patented.

Then in 1914 Mr. Morgan made another device and had patented. That device is what we now know as the gas mask. A device that has saved millions of lives. Unfortunately, due to the times he was living in he had problems selling the mask down South. Sooooo, Mr. Latimer hired a white actor who pretended to be the inventor and Mr. Latimer was his side kick and that business

was a success. Clever... yes? Gas masks are still being used today in many professions and they havesaved millions of lives. Mr. Latimer didn't stop there another one of his greatest inventions is something we see everyday THE RED LIGHT !!! and other cautionary lights. No matter where you are in the world you'll see these lights.

Mr. Morgan never escaped the arrows of racism but that never stopped him from inventing. Lack of recognition did stop him either he continued to invent and support his community until his death. Pretty good for a person who only had an elementary education.

BISHOP VASHTI MURPHY McKENZIE

BISHOP VASHTI MURPHY McKENZIE was born and raised in Baltimore,Maryland. She is the President and General Secretary of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the United States and was the first female Bishop in the AME Church History. She is now retired as a Bishop but made headlines when elected.



After graduating from college she had a great career in broadcasting and journalism. She felt the call to minister and it was in ministry where her life blossomed. She became the first of many positions that had never been held as a woman and kept climbing until she became the First Female Bishop.

I'm quite sure that her journey was not an easy one. Being the first of anything whether you are a man or a woman is not an easy road to travel. Yet she hung in there with the support of family, friends and God's Blessing.

Bishop McKenzie, Rev. Jarena Lee and other women in the ministry are great examples of women who listened and trusted the voice of God. Their persistence, courage and relationship with the Lord opened doors for many women. Their message to us is, Trust, Pray and Believe. Let God not fear rule in your life.

SUNDAY, APRIL 28, 2024 CODED SONGS

WHAT MIGHT YOU ASK ARE CODED SONGS? Well

let me tell you. These were songs that the slaves used to pass messages along to each other or other plantations. They were used to help runaway slaves, to notify you if there was trouble on the plantation, if someone was going to be sold or beaten. Before we were allowed to read or write we sang. Songs were a way of communication. These songs were often called Negro spirituals,



work songs, railroad and plantation songs. Sometimes they were sung as the Blues, a song to dance to or a song of mourning but what the white people heard and what the black people sang most of

the time had different meanings.

Hollywood did a job on us. We grew up thinking they were old silly slave songs. Something to laugh at or be embarrassed by. Sadly a lot of black churches did not pass on the mastery of these songs. After all we were free and did not want to be associated with or reminded of slavery. Yet the slaves were not in reality the way they were portrayed on screen. They were intelligent people who should be honored. They endured horrors and pain we could never imagine. Unfortunately, we dismissed or banned these songs in our own churches until Black History Month. However folks once again are making millions from our gifts. Coded songs are being sung in the Blues, Rock and Roll, Soul Music and other styles. Even heard a coded songs on commercials to adopt dogs. So, if you are in such a tizzy about Black History not being taught in schools, start teaching your child some of our songs, Something you can do at home and in church.

PROJECT DESIGN/SCHEMATIC	The project went to bid on March 25, 2024. Our consultant, Suzanna Barucco, will be managing the outreach and bid responses. There will be a mandatory bid meeting for all potential contractors on April 9, 2024. The bid documents circulated included the architectural drawings and project manual. All are asked to save the date of Monday, May 13, 2024, at 6:30pm via Bethel's Zoom for an official board/church conference pertaining to the construction process.
PROJECT COST ESTIMATE	A formal project cost estimate has been completed with commentary providing the overall increase of the project. This was shared with the congregation on February 26, 2024 as a part of the bid process which is to begin in early March, 2024.
PROJECT FINANCING	Project cost estimate was shared with the congregation on February 26, 2024. A formal appeal will be made to members/ friends of Bethel AME Church of Ardmore to financially support the beginning in April, 2024. Pastor and Commission on Stewardship and Finance are currently investigating other avenues to finance the project: grants, review of programs, outside donors, et al.
CHURCH AND COMMUNITY GARDEN LOT CONSOLIDATION	Praise be to God this is completed! Our legal counsel has been very attentive in working with Lower Merion Township and Montgomery County. The lot consolidation was approved. We are currently in the process of having the new deed recorded and forwarded to the necessary entities.
BETHEL COMMUNITY GARDEN	Community Garden will launch formally on Saturday, April 6, 2024, at Harverfarm at Haverford College. Various work day opportunities are available to support and help during the 2024 growing season.
TEMPORARY OFFICE LOCATION	A temporary office location has been secured at Ardmore Presbyterian Church for the Pastor, Community Garden Program and in other necessary administrative operations for the church.
VACCINATION CLINICS	Vaccination Clinics will continue take place in the Narthex of the church. We are grateful that Ardmore United Methodist Church has opened their doors to us for Vaccination Clinics when needed.
BUILDING CLEAN OUT AND DEMOLITION	We continue to work through clean out and demolition of the building. We have been notified of a few additional areas that will need to be handled prior to construction. Our consultant is handling this particular process.

It has been articulated to our Consultant/Architectural Team that we would like as much possible to be sure that we can continue to have Sunday Worship in the Sanctuary during the construction period.

We will endeavor to as best possible communicate to the congregation updates as the project unfolds.



3 SIMPLE WAYS TO FIGHT THE FLU

- 2. Stop the spread by practicing healthy habits & getting tested if you are sick.
- 3. Take antiviral prescriptions as prescribed by your doctor.

FLU SYMPTOMS & DIAGNOSIS

Common flu symptoms usually come on suddenly and can include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills (note that not everyone with flu will have a fever)
- Cough
- Sore throat
 Runny or stuffy nose

- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Vomiting and diarrhea may be common in children

Especially with flu and COVID circulating together—along with other respiratory diseases like RSV—it's important to be properly diagnosed to determine appropriate treatment. There are a number of tests available to determine if you have the flu. Your healthcare provider may test you for flu or diagnose you based on your symptoms.



What is Autism?

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. According to the Centers for Disease Control, autism affects an estimated 1 in 36 children in the United States today.

We know that there is not one autism but many subtypes, most influenced by a combination of genetic and environmental factors. Because autism is a spectrum disorder, each person with autism has a distinct set of strengths and challenges. The ways in which people with autism learn, think and problemsolve can range from highly skilled to severely challenged. Some people with ASD may require significant support in their daily lives, while others may need less support and, in some cases, live entirely independently.

Several factors may influence the development of autism, and it is often accompanied by sensory sensitivities and medical issues such as gastrointestinal (GI) disorders, seizures or sleep disorders, as well as mental health challenges such as anxiety, depression and attention issues.

Signs of autism usually appear by age 2 or 3. Some associated development delays can appear even earlier, and often, it can be diagnosed as early as 18 months. Research shows that early intervention leads to positive outcomes later in life for people with autism.

One of the most important things you can do as a parent or caregiver is to learn the early signs of autism and become familiar with the typical developmental milestones that your child should be reaching.

What Causes Autism?

THERE ARE MANY CAUSES OF AUTISM.

Research suggests that autism spectrum disorder (ASD) develops from a combination of:

- Genetic influences and
- Environmental influences, including social determinants

These factors appear to increase the risk of autism and shape the type of autism that a child will develop. However, it's important to keep in mind that increased risk is not the same as a cause. For example, some gene changes associated with autism can also be found in people who don't have the disorder. Similarly, not everyone exposed to an environmental risk factor for autism will develop the disorder. In fact, most will not.

How do genetic and environmental influences give rise to autism?

Most appear to affect crucial aspects of early brain development. Many autism risk genes influence other networks of genes, increasing or decreasing their expression. Some appear to affect how brain nerve cells, or neurons, communicate with each other. Others appear to affect how entire regions of the brain communicate with each other. Research continues to explore these differences with an eye to developing interventions and supports that can improve quality of life.

Do vaccines cause autism?

Vaccines do not cause autism. It is possible that the timing of an autism diagnosis might coincide with the recommended vaccine schedule for children and adolescents. But scientists have conducted extensive research over the last two decades to determine there is no link between childhood vaccinations and autism. The results of this research is clear: Vaccines do not cause autism. Additionally, vaccination can protect children from many preventable diseases like measles.

The American Academy of Pediatrics has compiled a comprehensive list of this research.

Is autism genetic?

Research tells us that autism tends to run in families, and a meta-analysis of 7 twin studies claim that 60 to 90% of the risk for autism comes from your genome. If you have a child with autism, you are more likely to have another autistic child. Your other family members are also more likely to have a child with ASD.

Changes in certain genes or your genome increase the risk that a child will develop autism. If a parent carries one or more of these gene changes, they may get passed to a child (even if the parent does not have autism). For some people, a high risk for ASD can be associated with a genetic disorder, such as Rett syndrome or fragile X syndrome. For the majority of autism, multiple changes in other regions of your DNA increase the risk of autism spectrum disorder. The majority of these DNA changes do not cause autism by themselves but work in conjunction with many other genes and environmental factors to cause autism.

If you or your child has ASD, we recommend that you explore genetic testing. Genetic testing could show you the genetic cause of you or your child's autism and reveal any genetic mutations that might be linked to serious cooccurring conditions like epilepsy. Genetic testing can give doctors useful information so they can provide better, more personalized interventions. Read two family's stories on how genomics help their understanding of autism and receiving personalized healthcare.

What environmental factors are associated with autism?

According to the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, certain environmental influences may increase autism risk:

• Advanced parental age

- Prenatal exposure to air pollution or certain pesticides
- Maternal obesity, diabetes or immune system disorders
- Extreme prematurity or very low birth weight
- Birth complications leading to periods of oxygen deprivation to the baby's brain

What are the signs of autism?

The autism diagnosis age and intensity of autism's early signs vary widely. Some infants show hints in their first months. In others, behaviors become obvious as late as age 2 or 3.

Not all children with autism show all the signs. Many children who don't have autism show a few. That's why professional evaluation is crucial.

The following may indicate your child is at risk for an autism spectrum disorder. If your child exhibits any of the following, ask your pediatrician or family doctor for an evaluation right away:

BY 6 MONTHS

- Few or no big smiles or other warm, joyful and engaging expressions
- Limited or no eye contact

BY 9 MONTHS

• Little or no back-and-forth sharing of sounds, smiles or other facial expressions

BY 12 MONTHS

- Little or no babbling
- Little or no back-and-forth gestures such as pointing, showing, reaching or waving
- Little or no response to name

BY 16 MONTHS

• Very few or no words

BY 24 MONTHS

• Very few or no meaningful, two-word phrases (not including imitating or repeating)

AT ANY AGE

- Loss of previously acquired speech, babbling or social skills
- Avoidance of eye contact
- Persistent preference for solitude
- Difficulty understanding other people's feelings
- Delayed language development
- Persistent repetition of words or phrases (echolalia)
- Resistance to minor changes in routine or surroundings
- Restricted interests
- Repetitive behaviors (flapping, rocking, spinning, etc.)
- Unusual and intense reactions to sounds, smells, tastes, textures, lights and/or colors

If you have concerns, get your child screened and contact your healthcare provider .

Autism Screening

There is no medical autism test, like a blood test, to diagnose autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Instead, experienced medical professionals examine a person's developmental history and behavior, interview and observe the person and their loved ones, and use professional screening and diagnostic tools to make a diagnosis.

While an autism diagnosis can only be given by a health care professional, there are several screening tools that can alert parents, caregivers and autistic people to potential autism symptoms. Early screening for autism can impact access to services and supports, which in turn can influence future outcomes for autistic individuals.

The screening tools below are designed to help identify children and adults who might have ASD. This list is not exhaustive and other tests are available. Please note that a positive result on a screening tool is NOT a diagnosis. A positive screening result should be followed by a thorough assessment by a health care professional.

Autism screening tools

FOR AGES 16 TO 30 MONTHS

The M-CHAT-R is a free parent-completed questionnaire that will ask a series of 20 questions about your child's behavior. You can use the results of the screener to discuss any concerns that you may have with your child's healthcare provider.

FOR AGES 12 TO 60 MONTHS

The SACS-R and SACS-PR are autism screening tools developed by La Trobe University and designed to identify behaviors that are characteristic of children on the spectrum from as young as 12 months old through preschool. This tool is meant to be administered by a trained psychologist, early childhood educator, allied health professional or other professional.

FOR SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN

Developed to be taken by parents, educators and medical professionals, Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center's (SARRC) 15-question Social Challenges Screening Questionnaire can identify children who may have symptoms that were once characterized as Asperger syndrome, now level 1 ASD.

AUTISM SPECTRUM QUOTIENT (AQ) TEST FOR AGES 16+ YEARS

The Autism Spectrum Quotient Test is a self-administered 50-question questionnaire used to measure autistic traits in adolescents and adults aged 16+. The questionnaire is suitable for people with an IQ over 80.




In 2020, Congress designated the new 988 dialing code to operate through the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) is the lead federal agency, in partnership with the Federal Communications Commission and the Department of Veterans Affairs, working to make the promise of 988 a reality for America. Moving to a 3-digit dialing code is a **once-in-a-lifetime opportunity** to strengthen and expand the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (the Lifeline).

Of course, 988 is more than just an easy-to-remember number—it is a direct connection to compassionate, accessible care and support for anyone experiencing mental health related distress – whether that is thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress. Preparing for full 988 implementation requires a bold vision for **a crisis care system that provides direct, life-saving services to all in need.**

SAMHSA sees 988 as a first step towards a transformed crisis care system in much the same way as emergency medical services have expanded in the US.




